HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD WITH

SPEAKING AND LISTENING

Encourage

Your child to exchange greetings and farewells in different situations such as making friends and introducing themselves.

Show

Your child how to use the telephone. Teach them what to say when they answer the phone and how to take a message.

Sing

Jingles, rhymes and songs. Say poems and chants together. Read favourite rhymes and stories aloud with lots of expression.

Practise

Following directions and giving instructions e.g. cooking, using make and do books.

Model

The use of nodding and eye contact e.g. show how to be an active listener.

Encourage

Your child to experiment with voice intonation and expression. Role play characters from favourite stories, e.g. re-enacting story time at school. A few dress ups will help.

Provide

A range of experiences that allow you to talk with your child.

Ask questions

About events and allow time before expecting a response. Encourage your child to ask questions to find out things.

<u>Share</u>

Retellings of events, promoting sequence and accuracy e.g. What happened first? What was the next thing you did?

<u>Suggest</u>

Ideas for show and tell and encourage a rehearsal of what your child will say and do.

<u>Compare</u>

The way in which we speak to others in formal and informal situations e.g. show and tell, playing with friends, meeting new adults.

<u>Listen</u>

To taped stories with read along books. Tape your own stories; make books to go with them.

<u>Play</u>

Listening and speaking games like I spy. Encourage your child to wait for an appropriate time to speak. Discourage interruptions.

Mode1

Standard speech and encourage your child to attempt appropriate patters e.g. I go park. Yes, we will go to the park.
