Dear Parents and Friends of Morisset Public School,

NAIDOC Week 2016

During the last week of school Morisset Public School celebrated NAIDOC week. The theme for this year's NAIDOC week was Songlines: The living narrative of our nation

For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, the Dreamtime describes a time when the earth, people and animals were created by our ancestral spiritual beings. Dreaming tracks crisscross Australia and trace the journeys of our ancestral spirits as they created the land, animals and lores. These dreaming tracks are sometimes called 'Songlines' as they record the travels of these ancestral spirits who 'sung' the land into life. These Songlines are recorded in traditional songs, stories, dance and art. They carry significant spiritual and cultural connection to knowledge, customs, ceremony and Lore of many Aboriginal nations and Torres Strait Islander language groups.

The week began on Monday with a whole school rotation of activities that included story writing, art and dance. On Tuesday staff from the WSLA schools attended professional learning at Morisset Public School. This included a trip to a local midden site with Aunty Daniela Chedzey. Wednesday was a significant day as the Learning Circle was officially opened. Again the school was lucky to have Aunty Daniela come along and open the circle with a smoking ceremony. Congratulations again to Jayden Butler whose design was chosen for the rainbow serpent that is now proudly on display, outside of the learning circle. This term staff and students will be learning more about the learning circle and how to best utilise it. Also on Wednesday some students were able to show their parents the Mgoals website. This is a site where students, parents and staff can record and monitor student goals. After an initial trial we are hoping to include all students in 2017. On Thursday the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students ran the school assembly that included a didj performance from some of the high school boys. Friday concluded the week with students participating in traditional Aboriginal games.

There were too many people to thank for a fantastic week. However special mention must go to Aunty Daniela, Jess Wegener, Selena Archibald, Berlinda Patterson, Cecilia Enoch, Mrs Duncan, Mrs Nichols and the Morisset High School boy's didj group. The students got so much out of it and we hope to make the week bigger and better next year.




